Executive Summary

Data Fest 2024, organized by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), successfully brought together key stakeholders from various sectors, including government, academia, international organizations, and the private sector. Held on October 21st and 22nd at the Pak-China Centre, the event served as a vibrant platform for promoting data-driven decision-making, fostering collaboration, and enhancing data literacy. It underscored the critical role of data in shaping future policies and driving socio-economic development in Pakistan.

The event featured a diverse array of activities, including keynote speeches, panel discussions, workshops, technical sessions, and stall exhibitions. Over 5,000 attendees participated in the two-day event, with more than 2,000 visitors exploring 48 exhibition stalls showcasing innovative data tools and solutions. These stalls not only displayed advancements in technology but also highlighted collaborative efforts across sectors to address pressing challenges. The workshops, attended by over 500 participants, provided hands-on training in areas such as data literacy, data science tools, machine learning, and policy analysis. Moreover, six keynote speeches and multiple panel discussions addressed critical topics such as data governance, artificial intelligence, sustainable development, and their intersection with Pakistan's socio-economic priorities.

The closing ceremony served as a moment of reflection and celebration, acknowledging the outstanding contributions of exhibitors, academic institutions, and partners who demonstrated a strong commitment to advancing data-driven solutions. Special awards and certificates were distributed to recognize exceptional efforts, while cultural performances added a vibrant and inclusive atmosphere, fostering informal networking and deeper collaboration among participants.

Despite the event's overall success, several lessons were identified to enhance future editions. Recommendations included increasing private sector participation, ensuring early planning and coordination, addressing internet connectivity issues, improving food management logistics, and refining the PBS dashboard for clearer data visualization and user experience. Additionally, efforts to include more interactive elements and diverse representation across sectors were suggested to maximize engagement and impact.

Data Fest 2024 not only highlighted the growing importance of data in Pakistan's socioeconomic development but also set the stage for ongoing partnerships, future initiatives, and a stronger data ecosystem. 1.1 Background

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) has recently completed the 7th Population &

Housing Census. marking the country's first-ever Digital Census. This significant national exercise gathered has essential demographic and socioeconomic covering data, like aspects education, employment, disability, migration, living



standards, WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene), and other basic facilities from households across Pakistan. As the largest digital initiative of its kind in South Asia, the Digital Census included geo-tagging residential, commercial, and industrial structures and cataloguing economic activities, establishing a comprehensive framework for the upcoming Economic Census. This newly collected information, along with other datasets accessible through PBS, will be an invaluable resource for government agencies, researchers, and academic institutions.

In line with the broader "Digital Transformation" agenda, PBS has transitioned to interactive, customized dashboards for data dissemination, delivering real-time data and historical trends through infographics to aid policy formulation. Notably, PBS's use of heat maps and population data from the 2017 census proved instrumental during COVID-19 for targeted or "smart" lockdowns. Currently, PBS is developing similar Decision Support Systems across various sectors, integrating census data with ministry data and PBS surveys. These systems, enhanced with GIS technology to produce informative heat maps and machine learning tools for trend analysis, are set to support proactive, data-driven decision-making for ministries.

The identification of key sectors for Data Fest 2024 was a crucial aspect of the event's

planning process, ensuring that the right stakeholders and experts were brought together to contribute to the discussions and showcase data-driven innovations. selection of sectors was guided by the overarching objective of Data Fest to promote the use of data for socio-economic development, innovation, and informed decision-making across various domains.

The following sectors initially were identified for active participation in Data Fest 2024:



- 1. International Organizations: Representatives from International organizations (Annex-B) such as UNICEF, UNFPA, World Bank, FAO, ILO and other international organization were included to bring a global perspective on data-driven development. Their expertise was invaluable in sharing best practices, lessons learned, and international standards for data collection, governance, and analytics.
- 2. Government/Semi Government Sector: This sector included various ministries, Government/Semi Government Sector (Annex-C), and public sector organizations responsible

for national development, economic policy, and public service delivery. Their involvement was critical in showcasing how data is used for policy formulation, monitoring government programs, and achieving sustainable development goals (SDGs). As part of the preparatory activities, the Data Fest Secretariat has confirmed the details of **181** government organizations and semi-government organizations. This verification process included phone calls to validate crucial information, such as the names and designations of key contacts, postal addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses within these organizations. Signed letters from the Member (SS/RM) were sent to the postal addresses of 181 government and semi-government sectors. Additionally, emails were also sent to all these organizations. Out of these, 19 organizations confirmed their participation for stall setups.

- **3. Academia and Research:** Universities, Research institutions, and academic (*Annex-D*) experts were invited to participate, contributing insights on data science, statistics, and technology. This sector played an important role in discussing the latest advancements in data analytics, as well as how research and data-driven methodologies can inform public policy and business strategies. In total, **53** academic institutions were engaged for the Data Fest event. Of these, three expressed interest in setting up stalls, while others chose to participate in workshops and panel discussions. The response from academia was very positive, contributing significantly to the event's overall success, particularly in terms of footfall. Many institutions actively participated in knowledge-sharing sessions, engaging in insightful dialogues on data and its applications across sectors. Their involvement not only enriched the workshops and discussions but also drew a considerable number of attendees, highlighting academia's enthusiastic support and interest in Data Fest's mission. Out of these, 03 Academia expressed interest in setting up a stall.
- **4. Private Sector:** Industry leaders, tech companies, and business executives from various sectors were included to highlight the role of data in driving innovation, improving business operations, and creating new products and services. The private sector's (*Annex-E*) participation emphasized the commercial application of data and the growing importance of data analytics in business decision-making. As part of the preparations for Data Fest, the Secretariat has verified information for 135 private organizations and banks. This process involved phone calls to confirm essential details, including the names and positions of primary contacts, postal addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses. Signed letters from the Member (SS/RM) were sent to the postal addresses of these 135 organizations, along with follow-up emails. Of these, only one organization expressed interest in setting up a stall.
- **5. NGOs and Civil Society:** NGOs and civil society organizations (*Annex-F*) were identified as key contributors, particularly in terms of using data for social good. Their involvement in areas like poverty alleviation, health, education, and disaster management showcased the role of data in addressing pressing societal challenges and promoting transparency and accountability. In preparation for Data Fest, the Secretariat verified details for **30** NGOs, confirming essential information through phone calls, such as primary contacts' names, designations, postal addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses. Signed letters from the





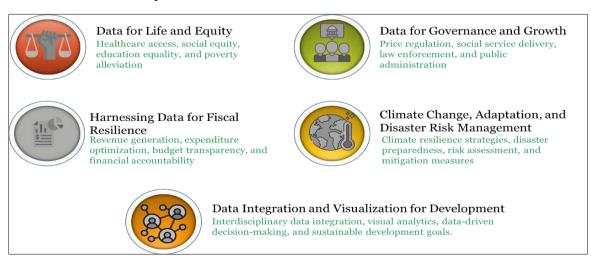
Member (SS/RM) were sent to these organizations' postal addresses, followed by emails. Out of these, 06 organizations expressed interest in setting up a stall.

6. IT & Telco's Sector: This sector (*Annex-G*) involved tech companies, data scientists, GIS experts, and IT professionals who showcased the latest technologies in data visualization, machine learning, artificial intelligence (AI), and Geographic Information Systems (GIS). Their contributions focused on the technical aspects of data collection, analysis, and the tools that facilitate the effective use of data for decision-making. In preparation for Data Fest, the Secretariat conducted a thorough verification of details for **151** IT and telecommunications companies. This process involved making phone calls to confirm essential information, including the names and titles of key contacts, postal addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses. Signed letters from the Member (SS/RM) were sent to these organizations' postal addresses, followed by follow-up emails. As a result, 12 companies expressed interest in setting up stalls. The government sector significantly contributed to Data Fest by establishing stalls focused on the IT sector.

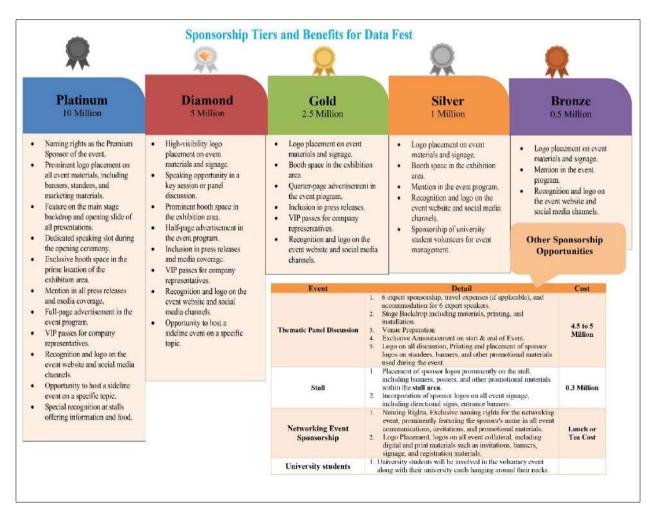


2.6 Sponsorship Packages: -

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) introduced a structured sponsorship framework to engage international and national organizations, as well as stakeholders, in supporting Data Fest 2024. This framework featured tiered sponsorship packages, namely Platinum, Diamond, Gold, Silver, and Bronze, each offering unique benefits tailored to the level of contribution.

The Platinum tier was the highest level, granting naming rights as the premium sponsor, prominent logo placement on event materials, exclusive speaking opportunities, and significant visibility during the event's opening ceremony. Additionally, PBS offered targeted sponsorship opportunities for specific event components, such as thematic panel discussions, networking events, and student volunteer programs. By providing these diverse sponsorship options, PBS ensured that organizations of all sizes could participate, thereby securing the resources necessary to host a successful and impactful Data Fest 2024.







2.7 Budget Preparation: -

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) meticulously prepared the budget for Data Fest 2024,

ensuring comprehensive allocation of resources across various critical components to guarantee the event's success. With an estimated budget of 60 Million PKR from PBS, the planning encompassed securing a premium venue equipped with interactive features, advanced branding, decorative elements, and animations, alongside multiple SMD screens to



enhance the event's visual and interactive experience. A series of panel discussions, workshops, and stations were carefully planned, complemented by professional printing, media outreach, and strategic publicity to amplify the event's visibility and impact. The budget also accounted for essential items such as pole streamers, branded merchandise, and custom-designed materials, along with provisions for exhibition stalls and miscellaneous expenses. Each contribution from PBS and partnering organizations was strategically aligned to cover specific needs, ensuring a seamless and impactful execution. By coordinating these elements, PBS optimized the budget to deliver a high-quality event while fostering innovation, collaboration, and a data-driven culture in Pakistan.

After preparing the estimated budget, PBS realized that it did not have sufficient funds to successfully execute this activity. Therefore, PBS approached several international organizations, including UNICEF, UNFPA, UNHCR, UNDP, World Bank, FAO, and Asian Development Bank (ADB), to secure budget pledges.

To facilitate this process, Ms. Rabia Awan Deputy Director General (DDG) played a pivotal role by conducting both Zoom and in-person meetings with representatives from these organizations. These meetings served as a platform to present the objectives and scope of Data Fest 2024, emphasizing its alignment with global development goals such as promoting data-driven decision-making, enhancing transparency, and fostering socio-economic progress.

During these discussions, PBS team highlighted key elements of the event, such as workshops, panel discussions, venue arrangements, and media campaigns, demonstrating how each component would contribute to the broader vision of fostering a data-driven culture in Pakistan. The meetings also focused on establishing partnerships, exploring potential areas of collaboration, and detailing how each organization's contributions would be utilized.

This proactive engagement led to significant commitments from international organizations, with each pledging to cover specific areas such as venue arrangements, branding, workshops, and logistics. The collaborative approach not only ensured the financial





back-up necessary for the event but also laid the foundation for long-term partnerships with

these esteemed global institutions. Through these efforts, PBS successfully overcame its budgetary constraints and ensured the seamless planning and execution of Data Fest 2024.

A significant milestone achieved in the first meeting between PBS and UNICEF. During this session, they expressed strong support for Data Fest 2024, pledging not only financial backing but also strategic alignment with international development goals. Their sponsorship underscored the event's relevance to global objectives such promoting data-driven decision-making and fostering socioeconomic advancement.



PBS also conducted extensive discussions with other international organizations, including UNICEF, UNFPA, UNHCR, UNDP, ILO, ADB, FAO and national institutions like HEC, NADRA, and SUPARCO. These collaborative meetings explored diverse participation models and identified targeted funding opportunities. This strategic engagement resulted in significant sponsorship commitments, with each partner pledging support for specific areas aligned with their expertise.

By fostering strong partnerships with international organizations such as UNFPA, UNICEF, the World Bank, FAO, ADB, and ILO, PBS successfully secured a total sponsorship of 42.07 Million PKR (*Annex-J*) for Data Fest 2024. These collaborations were established early in the planning process, demonstrating PBS's proactive approach to ensuring robust financial support. This substantial sponsorship not only reflects the confidence of global institutions in the event's vision but also enables PBS to execute Data Fest 2024 at the highest standards, fostering innovation, transparency, and collaboration within Pakistan's data ecosystem.

The collaboration with UNICEF & UNFPA proved to be a pivotal moment, establishing credibility and setting the stage for additional sponsorships. This success motivated PBS to intensify its outreach, securing further commitments from key stakeholders to enhance the event's impact and sustainability. By fostering these partnerships, PBS not only ensured the success of Data Fest 2024 but also laid the groundwork for long-term collaboration and innovation in Pakistan's data ecosystem.



















2.8 Activity Plan for Data Fest 2024

To ensure the success of Data Fest 2024, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics designed a diverse activity plan encompassing the following key categories:

- 3. **Panel Discussions**: Brought together thought leaders from government, academia, and the private sector to address critical issues, explore challenges, and propose actionable solutions in the data domain.
- 4. **Workshops**: Conducted skill-building sessions on data science, analytics, and policy applications, equipping participants with practical tools and techniques to enhance their expertise.
- 5. **Networking Sessions**: Provided an interactive space for attendees to build connections, share experiences, and explore opportunities for collaboration across various fields.
- 6. **Data Product Demonstrations**: Highlighted cutting-edge technologies and data-driven innovations through live demonstrations, enabling participants to experience their real-world applications firsthand.





2.9 Nomination of Focal Person for Each Sector:

To ensure the smooth and efficient coordination of Data Fest 2024, with the approval of Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, Member (SS/RM), Focal Persons were nominated, (Annex-K) for each sector involved in the event. This step was crucial in enhancing sector-specific coordination, streamlining communication, and ensuring that each sector's contributions were effectively integrated into the overall event planning and execution process.

2.10 Participation Proforma: -

Each sector participating in Data Fest 2024 including Government and Semi-Government (*Annex-M*), Private Sector (*Annex-N*), IT and Telecommunications (*Annex-O*), NGOs and Civil Society (*Annex-P*), and Academia & Research (*Annex-Q*) developed tailored proforma to ensure that their contributions aligned with the event's goals and their sector-specific priorities. These proforma were carefully designed to capture sector-relevant details, such as the key themes they wished to highlight, the nature of discussions and panels they intended to participate in, and the exhibitions, stalls, or activities they planned to organize. By customizing the proforma, each sector was able to effectively communicate its potential contributions, ensuring that its involvement was both meaningful and impactful. This approach also facilitated better coordination among the organizing committees and participants, creating a more structured and engaging experience for attendees. The tailored proforma served as essential tools in harmonizing the diverse interests and objectives of the various sectors represented at Data Fest 2024.

2.11 Communication & Engagements: -

Effective communication and stakeholder engagement are vital components for the success of

Data Fest 2024, ensuring participation diverse and fostering collaborations across sectors. The engagement strategies included a mix of communication, written discussions. telephonic meetings, and seminars to raise awareness and promote active involvement.

Telephone Calls:

Telephone calls were made to ensure that the key stakeholders receive personal



attention and were fully informed about the event. Calls helped to address questions, clarify event details, and discuss specific needs or requests from participants.

Letters:

Official letters (*Annex-R*) were sent to key stakeholders across various sectors International organizations, Government/Semi Government sector, NGOs & Civil Societies, Private Sector, IT & Telco's and Academic & Research. These letters included invitations to participate, detailed event agendas, sponsorship opportunities, and requests for collaboration. Formal letters ensured a professional approach and facilitated a structured engagement with key organizations.

CP&C (Coordination, Planning, and Communication) section played a crucial role in preparing, dispatching, and sending all official letters to the various organizations involved. They handled each step, from drafting the letters to ensuring their delivery through postal





services. This involved careful coordination to ensure that all communications were properly addressed, dispatched on time, and securely delivered to the respective organizations. Their efforts were essential in maintaining smooth communication and facilitating effective outreach to all stakeholders involved in the event.

Emails:

A series of emails were sent to ensure continued communication with potential participants and contributors. Email campaigns were designed for:

Through this effective collaboration, PBS and **Event** Management Company delivered a well-

2.13 Development of Data Fest Portal: -

For Data Fest, the Information Technology (IT) Support Services Section of Pakistan

Bureau of Statistics (PBS) was responsible for creating the event portal, generating QR code, setting up a dedicated official email address, and procuring the domain for Data Fest 2024. The goal was to user-friendly create a and comprehensive platform to enhance the experience for all attendees. The PBS IT Department ensured the portal featured with a range of functionalities essential for the smooth organization and execution of the event. Beyond financial oversight, the committee plays a pivotal role in supervising the planning and execution of various event-related activities. This includes reviewing logistics, coordinating with key stakeholders, addressing operational challenges, and ensuring that the event adheres to its defined objectives and timeline. Their involvement ensures that all components ranging from venue arrangements and technical sessions to branding and stakeholder engagements are executed seamlessly.

With their comprehensive oversight and well-defined Terms of Reference (TORs), the Management Committee serves as a cornerstone of the event, facilitating smooth operations and fostering collaboration among all involved parties to achieve the overarching vision of Data Fest 2024.

3 Media Section Activities at Data Fest: -

3.1 Pre Data Fest Activities: -

Initial Outreach and Follow-up: To establish strong partnerships and ensure comprehensive coverage for Data Fest 2024, engagement letters were distributed to relevant stakeholders in August, followed by a reissuance in October to reinforce communication and solidify commitments. Alongside this effort, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was meticulously prepared to formalize collaborations. However, during discussions with media representatives—including the Bureau Chief, PID, Mindmap, and the Event Management Company—it was conveyed that while they expressed significant interest in providing full coverage for the event, their internal policies do not support formalizing partnerships through MOUs. Branding Elements:

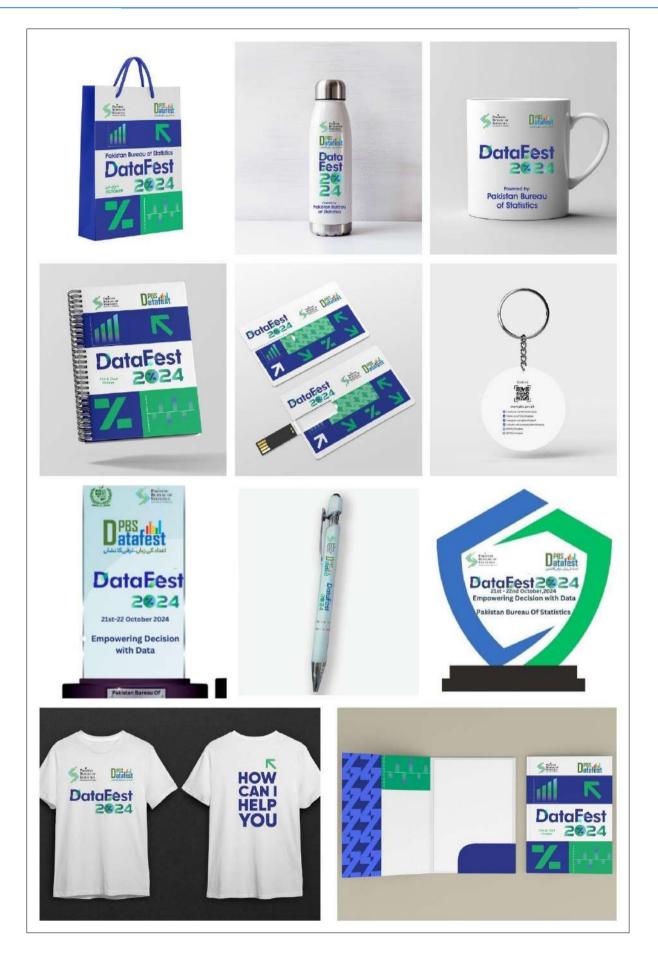

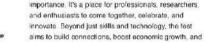

4.2 Invitation letters to Universities and Follow up Strategy: -

Dispatching of Invitation letters to universities was a key step to establish collaboration and securing participation from Research & Academia. These letters were accompanied by relevant documents like concept notes, thematic areas, research & academia brochures, Data Fest Booklet and participation proformas for students and faculty which offered a detailed overview of the event its objectives, and the mutual benefits for all involved institutions. Alongside the dispatch, follow-up calls to university representatives ensured that the communication has been received, clarifying any queries and reinforcing the invitation to participate. Maintaining a consistent follow-up strategy was crucial, as it provided an opportunity for feedback, enabling adjustments based on the stakeholders' interests. At the initial stage 44 universities were selected across Pakistan to send an invite to participate in Data Fest and the number of universities increased later to 54. The follow up strategy was thoroughly implemented telephonically and by email with prompt response to queries.

4.3 Meetings with Universities: -

Additionally, meetings were conducted in main universities in Islamabad and Rawalpindi e.g. NUST, IIUI, QAU, AIR, FAST, ARID, RWU and COMSATS and focal points were established with the nomination of potential focal persons of the respective institutions. At the provincial level top 2 universities were approached and meetings were conducted by PBS regional offices teams to encourage participation. However, many universities were approached at provincial level to invite for participation. Data Fest Posters were displayed in all main universities of Islamabad and brochure and other informative material was also distributed at Federal and Provincial level universities.

4.4 Proposals from Academia: -

The response from Academia for participation in Data Fest was overwhelming with 6 panel discussions, 49 workshops including keynote presentations, poster presentations, exhibition and data storytelling proposals. Also, NUST, AIR and LUMS established stalls in data festival with students' projects and faculty research work prominently NCBC LAB, a joint venture by NUST and LUMS. This coordinated approach fosters engagement, strengthens academic networks, and paves the way for productive partnerships.

4.5 Progress review meetings: -

All the progress related to Academia involvement was regularly shared during the progress review meetings conducted on weekly basis.

4.6 Seminars at Universities: -

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics conducted Seminars at various universities to aware faculty and students about the available opportunities for them in Data Fest. These seminars aimed to motivate students to participate in the Data Festival. The PBS team presented details about the festival, highlighting the importance of data in today's world. Byshowcasing how





data drives decision-making and innovation, the seminar emphasized the critical role that accurate data plays in societal development. Engaging students in this discourse not only fosters their interest in data analytics but also prepares them for future careers in a data-driven environment. This initiative underscores the significance of seminars as platforms for knowledge sharing and skill development. At the end of all Seminars students were registered online as volunteers for Data Festival.

4.7 Volunteer Management & Responsibilities of Data Fest Ambassadors

Session During Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal (SI), Member (SS/RM) discussed the goals and expected outcomes of the Data Fest. The were duties also



distributed among volunteers. A brief overview of the organization and a team building exercise related to workshop themes were provided to Volunteers. An open floor for questions and discussion was provided by the end of session. This workshop was an amazing opportunity for volunteers to connect with each other and organizers. A comprehensive work plan was shared with the students and a team comprising of PBS officers and Volunteers was constituted for the smooth execution of Data Fest.







4.9 Transport Management for Volunteers: -

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) managed (*Annex-V*) transportation for students over three days, successfully picking up nearly 300 students from various universities for the orientation held at the Pak-China Centre on 20th October, 2024. Additionally, PBS facilitated transport for 392 volunteers and 282 visitors from different universities to attend the Data Festival on both days of event. This comprehensive logistical support ensured that all participants had access to valuable learning opportunities and could engage fully in the event.

5 Stalls Management: -

The success of Data Fest 2024 was, in large part, driven by the meticulous planning and coordination carried out by the Data Fest Secretariat, which played a pivotal role in ensuring the smooth execution of the event, particularly in the management of stalls. From the initial stages of the event's conception to the final moments, the Secretariat was at the heart of organizing the structure and logistics that made the event run seamlessly.

One of the key responsibilities of the Data Fest Secretariat was overseeing the setup and handover of responsibilities to the Stall Management Committee. The Secretariat's role involved detailed planning, including the categorization of stalls, aligning their placement, and ensuring that each exhibitor's requirements were clearly understood and met. By managing this groundwork, the Secretariat created a solid foundation for the subsequent efforts of the Stall Management Committee. The stalls were categorized as follows:

- 1. **Premium Stalls** (20x10 ft) High-visibility spaces for maximum exposure.
- 2. **Essential Stalls** (18x9 ft) Mid-range with moderate visibility.
- 3. **Standard Stalls** (18x9 ft) Basic options with reasonable presence.
- 4. **Basic Stalls** (9x9 ft) Affordable, compact stalls ideal for smaller organizations.

After the Data Fest Secretariat hands over its completed work to the Stall Management Committee, the Stall Management Committee takes over the responsibility of managing the stalls during the event.

The Stall Management Committee holds daily meetings with the focal persons nominated by the Data Fest Secretariat for each stall. These focal persons are responsible for specific aspects of the stall, such as setup, maintenance, and interaction with attendees. During these meetings, the committee reviews progress, addresses any concerns, and ensures that everything is on track. In these meetings, the stall focal persons provide updates on the status of their assigned stalls. By conducting these daily meetings and maintaining clear communication, the Stall Management Committee ensures that the event runs smoothly, with all stalls functioning efficiently and meeting the expectations of both participants and attendees.

The Data Fest Secretariat dispatched letters (*Annex-W*) and also sent emails to the nominated focal persons from stakeholder organizations for confirmation of the stalls. These communications were aimed at confirming the participation of the organizations, ensuring that the stalls were reserved, and clarifying any requirements or expectations related to the setup.





The letters and emails outlined key details, such as the stall allocation, setup guidelines, event schedules, and any other relevant information, ensuring that the focal persons were fully informed and prepared for their role in the event. This process helped streamline coordination between the Data Fest Secretariat, the Stall Management Committee, and the stakeholder organizations, ensuring a smooth and organized event setup.

5.1 Pre-Event Stall Preparation

1. Technical Requirements

- PBS created a checklist to verify all items and equipment present at the stall.
- Arrangements for electricity, internet connectivity, and AV equipment.
- Providing access to data visualization software, AI platforms, or any special tools needed by tech or AI stalls.

2. Branding and Stall Design

- Uniform stall design guidelines to maintain consistency while allowing for customization (banners, screens, digital displays).
- Coordination with sponsors and partners for any additional branding or promotional materials.

3. Mock Setup and Final Checks

- Conducting mock stall setups to ensure all equipment, displays, and interactive features work seamlessly.
- Final technical checks, including Wi-Fi connectivity, interactive demo readiness, and audio-visual equipment.

5.2 Floor Plan and Layout Design: -

The floor plan and layout (*Annex-X*) for Data Fest 2024 have been meticulously designed to optimize visitor engagement and create a seamless flow throughout the venue. Each stall's placement has been carefully planned, taking into account key factors such as foot traffic patterns, visibility, and accessibility. High-traffic areas have been identified to ensure maximum exposure for exhibitors, while clear pathways guide attendees through the venue, minimizing congestion and enhancing their overall experience. Additionally, the layout fosters a balance between thematic zones, allowing visitors to explore related stalls conveniently while ensuring no exhibitor is overshadowed. Strategic positioning near entrances, exits, and other focal points further boosts visibility, creating an engaging and equitable environment for all participants. This thoughtful arrangement aims to maximize attendee interactions with exhibitors and deliver a memorable and efficient experience for everyone involved.





6 Panel Discussion at Data Fest-2024: -

Panel discussions were carefully organized to align with the overarching themes of the festival, addressing pressing issues such as social equity, governance, fiscal resilience, climate adaptation, and data integration. Each session featured renowned national and international experts who shared their knowledge and practical experiences, fostering meaningful dialogue among attendees. The discussions provided a unique platform for bridging gaps between data producers, users, and policymakers, while promoting collaborative approaches to leveraging data for societal progress.

6.1 Materials Prepared for a Panel Discussion

To ensure a successful and impactful panel discussion, meticulous preparation was undertaken, leveraging a combination of structured documents, collaborative efforts, and regular engagements. The materials and steps used include:

6.2 Objectives of the Panel Discussions

- 1. **Promoting Data-Driven Decision-Making**: The sessions highlighted practical examples of how data has been and can be utilized to inform policies and programs addressing societal challenges.
- 2. **Fostering Cross-Sector Collaboration**: Stakeholders from government, academia, civil society, and international organizations came together, fostering a spirit of collaboration and mutual learning.
- 3. **Addressing Data Gaps**: Experts identified key data gaps, particularly in areas such as climate change, governance, and social equity, and proposed actionable strategies to address them.

6.3 Key Themes of the Panel Discussions

The panel discussions revolved around the festival's central themes, ensuring a comprehensive exploration of topics crucial to Pakistan's socio-economic development:

- Data for Life and Equity: Sessions in this track delved into the critical role of demographic, education, and socioeconomic data in addressing key challenges related to social equity, healthcare access, and poverty alleviation. Participants explored how data can highlight disparities, identify vulnerable populations, and guide targeted interventions. Case studies and success stories demonstrated how effective data utilization can ensure equitable distribution of resources and promote inclusive development, fostering a fairer and more balanced society.
- Harnessing Data for Fiscal Resilience: This theme emphasized the pivotal role of data in strengthening fiscal resilience. Discussions focused on leveraging data analytics to optimize revenue generation, streamline government expenditures, and enhance





fiscal transparency and accountability. Panelists presented innovative strategies for identifying untapped revenue streams, curbing inefficiencies, and monitoring public spending to improve financial stability and build trust with stakeholders. The role of advanced tools and technologies in fiscal management was also explored, providing actionable insights for policymakers and financial experts.

- Data for Governance and Growth: Panels under this theme highlighted the transformative impact of data in driving effective governance, improving public service delivery, and fostering economic growth. Experts shared insights on how data-driven decision-making can address governance challenges, enhance citizen engagement, and streamline administrative processes. Experts discussed the integration of geospatial data, remote sensing, and predictive models to anticipate climate-related risks and develop proactive mitigation strategies. The role of data in crafting adaptive policies, managing natural resources, and coordinating disaster response efforts was emphasized, underscoring the importance of evidence-based planning in addressing environmental challenges.
- Data Integration and Visualization for Development: This theme revolved around the interdisciplinary integration of data and the use of visual analytics to support evidence-based decision-making. Presentations showcased how combining datasets from various sectors—such as health, education, and economy—can yield powerful insights and reveal patterns that guide strategic actions. Tools and techniques for creating interactive dashboards, geographic information systems (GIS), and other visualization platforms were demonstrated, highlighting their utility in making complex data accessible and actionable for policymakers, researchers, and the public alike.

6.7 Regular Online Zoom Meetings with Panelists

To promote alignment and collaboration, Management Committee, organized a series of virtual meetings with all panelists. The objectives and structure of these meetings were as follows:

• Agenda Setting:

Each meeting had a clear agenda, such as finalizing discussion topics, reviewing concept notes, or resolving ambiguities in the panel structure.

• Role Assignment:

Specific roles and responsibilities were assigned to each panelist, ensuring that all key aspects of the themes were addressed comprehensively.

• Content Revisions:

Collaborative reviews of the concept note and other preparatory materials were conducted to refine the content based on panelists' expertise and insights.

Planning and Coordination Checklist for Panel Discussion: -

The "Check List of Activities" (Annex-Z) outlines a detailed plan for organizing a professional event, focusing on effective coordination and thorough preparation. It emphasizes collaboration with sponsors and stakeholders, including tasks such as finalizing panelists, preparing alternate lists, obtaining CVs and photographs, and developing profiles for approval. The design and setup of the stage and backdrop, along with panel discussion arrangements, are to be finalized with input and approval from the sponsors and management committee. Keynotes and questions for the moderator are to be reviewed and approved by the Management Committee or Chief Statistician.

The checklist also includes scheduling and planning activities, such as developing detailed plans for Day 1 and Day 2, assigning specific teams or individuals, and conducting preliminary Zoom meetings with panelists and moderators. Additionally, it involves compiling comprehensive contact lists of PBS employees and participants from the public and private sectors. Any changes in panelists are to be communicated promptly to the Data Fest Secretariat or Management Committee using a prescribed proforma. Finally, the checklist ensures the timely provision of participant and panelist contact details for sending invitations. This structured approach ensures accountability, clear communication, and efficient management of all aspects of the event.





7 Workshop Arrangements

7.1 Stakeholder Outreach and Engagement for workshop

The Data Fest Secretariat reached out to all identified stakeholders across various sectors by using multiple communication channels, including official letters, emails, telephone calls, and participation proforma. These efforts ensured that all stakeholders were adequately informed about the upcoming workshops and invited to confirm their participation. Once the stakeholders responded and confirmed their intent to participate, a comprehensive and finalized list of participants was compiled. Following this, *all the gathered materials, details, and necessary documentation were systematically handed over to the Workshop Management Committee.* This allowed for seamless coordination and smooth correspondence moving forward, ensuring the workshops would be effectively managed and executed.

- Maintain a professional atmosphere in each workshop with structured session flow.
- Recognize presenters by awarding certificates at the end of each session to honor their contributions.

Leverage Presenter Feedback for Future Events:

- Collect and analyze feedback from participants to refine future workshops.
- Identify gaps or new themes based on feedback for better alignment with future data needs.

By adhering to these objectives, the Workshop Management team aimed to create an efficient, collaborative, and impactful environment for all participants, ensuring the success of the PBS Data Festival workshop.

7.4 In House Meetings of Workshop Management:

A series of in-house meetings were held to effectively distribute tasks and assign roles to all team members, ensuring a well-coordinated effort. Further an online meeting with the focal persons from Event Management Company, the event organizer, was also held to understand their role and the extent of their preparations for the Data Festival. This meeting helped to ensure that all aspects of the event were aligned and well-coordinated, and both PBS and Event Management Company were fully prepared for a seamless execution of the workshops.

7.5 Scrutiny of Presentations for the PBS Data Festival Workshops:

The initial data of interested participants provided by the Data Fest Secretariat was carefully scrutinized by the Workshop Management (Annex-AA) comprised of Dr. Bahrawar Jan, (DDG) Mr. Rizwan Bashir (Director) and Ms. Kanwal Murtaza (CSO) based on themes and areas of interest. Participants were contacted via email to obtain their credentials and PowerPoint presentations.

Once presentations were received, each underwent a thorough review by the focal persons to ensure matching with the festival's themes. Workshop Management then provided detailed guidelines to the presenters through email, instructing them on necessary modifications, including content and slide count, to fit their assigned time slots.

- For One (1)-hour presentations, presenters were advised to prepare 12 to 15 slides, which included a 15-minute Q&A session.
- For 30-minutes presentations, presenters were asked to limit their slide count to 10 slides, with a 10-minute Q&A session.





These guidelines ensured that each presentation was well-structured, focused, and allowed ample time for audience interaction and feedback.

Dr. Bahrawar Jan (DDG) floated the idea that each workshop should be moderated by a Chair, this was endorsed by Workshop Management team. It was decided that the chair could either be an officer of PBS or a presenter from another workstation. PBS took great pride in extending the honor of chairing presentations to presenters from different organizations enhancing the collaborative spirit of the event. Workshop Management reached out to potential chairs, sharing the schedules and requesting their availability. Based on their ease and preferences, time slots were adjusted to ensure smooth coordination.

7.6 Staff of Workshop Management:

Each focal person engaged the strengths of their respective sections, voluntarily, and the Data Fest Secretariat provided support staff for the initiative. 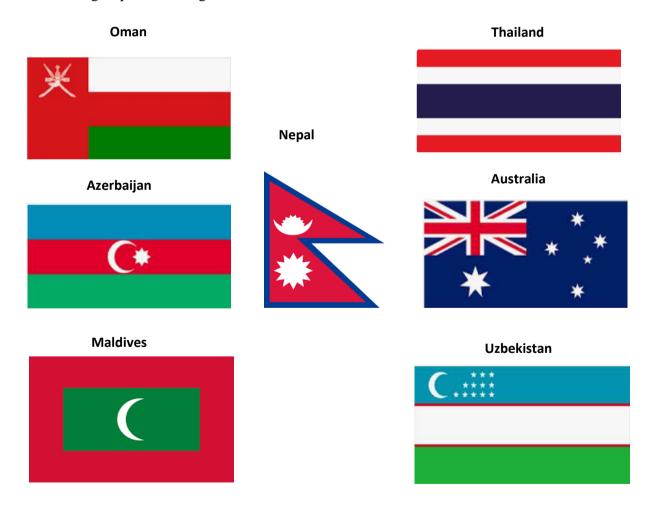






8.3 Involvement of International Organization

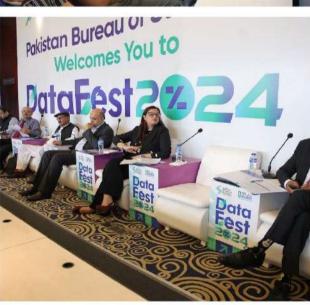

Pakistan's economic development often faces challenges due to the lack of data-driven decision-making. Globally, data is a cornerstone for crafting, implementing, and monitoring effective policies. Data integration, the consolidation of information from diverse sources offers policymakers a comprehensive understanding of complex issues by combining fragmented datasets from government agencies, NGOs, research institutions, and public and private sectors. This holistic approach ensures that policies address economic trends and social welfare issues effectively.

Despite the wealth of data generated across sectors like healthcare, education, finance, and public safety, much of it remains siloed, fragmented, and underutilized. Addressing these gaps through data integration requires robust mechanisms for standardization, verification, and quality assurance. Reliable datasets enable in-depth analyses, identification of root causes, and predictions of policy impacts. For example, integrated health data from hospitals, surveys, and environmental monitoring systems can inform timely interventions for disease outbreaks.

Complementing integration, data visualization plays a crucial role in simplifying complex information, fostering transparency, and enhancing decision-making. Visual tools such as dashboards, charts, and heat maps enable policymakers to quickly interpret trends, patterns, and outliers. Interactive visualizations allow simulation of policy scenarios, such as tracking the impact of unemployment programs or monitoring environmental conservation efforts. Real-time visualization tools facilitate ongoing evaluation of policies, enabling adjustments to ensure alignment with goals, resource efficiency, and accountability.

Topic: Data Integration for Growth and Development **Focal Person: Syed Abdul Qadir Shah, DG (ES)**

Data integration is essential for fostering growth and development in Pakistan's economy, which is valued at over \$350 billion and comprises agriculture, industry, and services contributing 25%, 21%, and 54% to GDP, respectively. Despite this potential, fragmented and underutilized data hampers productivity and policy effectiveness across sectors. The agriculture sector, a cornerstone of rural economies and downstream industries like textiles and food processing, suffers from skewed landholdings 90% of farms are under 12 acres limited access to markets and financial systems, and vulnerabilities to climate change. Integrating data on agricultural output, land records, and geospatial indicators can help improve productivity, enable fiscal assessments, and unlock value-added industrial opportunities. Similarly, the industrial sector faces challenges due to a concentration of large-scale enterprises in urban hubs and a lack of linkages with micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), which limits growth and innovation. Integrated data on enterprise performance can empower organizations like SMEDA and the State Bank of Pakistan to design targeted policies and enhance private sector engagement.

The services sector, particularly retail, is the largest contributor to GDP and is expanding beyond major urban centers, driven by digital payment systems, inventory management tools, and e-commerce platforms. However, these advancements are largely consumption-focused, with little attention to enhancing productivity among small and medium producers. Data integration from sources like geotagged retail structures, electricity consumption, and FMCG sales can provide insights to support retail growth, improve tax documentation, and create scalable opportunities for startups and supply chains. Fiscal opportunities across sectors are vast; for instance, integrating SUPARCO data with land records can enable precise agricultural taxation, while retail data can be analyzed to estimate revenue and tax potential, contributing to an equitable and effective fiscal system.

Pakistan, with a population of 241.5 million as per the 2023 census, is grappling with significant education challenges, particularly in terms of access and quality. The latest data reveals that over 25 million children aged 5-16 are out of school, and a staggering 80% of late primary-age children lack proficiency in reading. This situation is particularly concerning as it is 21 percentage points worse than the average for South Asia and 19 percentage points worse than the average for lower-middle-income countries. Despite efforts by the Pakistan Institute for Education and national surveys like PSLM and PDHS, education gaps persist, especially among marginalized communities, and have been further exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and the 2022 floods. These challenges hinder the development of human capital, which is crucial for both economic growth and social development.

8.6 Exhibition/Stalls

1. Stall Setup and Logistics

- On-site setup process on the day before or the morning of the event.

Exhibitors are encouraged to provide insights and suggestions, helping us improve stall aesthetics and ensure that future setups meet their expectations and branding needs.

- A tailored feedback form was designed specifically for exhibitors from each sector to gather their insights and suggestions for enhancing future events. This form aims to capture exhibitors' unique experiences, highlight areas of success, and pinpoint opportunities for improvement across sectors.
- Quick response teams to address any concerns or improve stall engagement in real time.

Stall Distribution and Sectoral Participation at Data Fest 2024

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics: -

8.7 Workshop Operations:

The workshop, scheduled for two days, was successfully concluded within the same timeframe. Notably, the number of presentations exceeded the planned **52 presentations** by four. Thus, a total of **56** Presentations were delivered across 42 time slots at 6 workstations. 8.8 Volunteer Management and Communication at Data Festival 2024

12 Lessons Learned

The insights and takeaways from organizing and executing Data Fest 2024. It highlights the challenges faced, areas for improvement, and recommendations to ensure the event's success in the future. By analyzing key aspects such as stakeholder participation, planning, coordination, resource management, and overall event execution, these lessons aim to guide better decision-making, streamline processes, and enhance the quality and impact of upcoming events.

1. Private Sector Participation

The participation of private sector organizations was significantly lower compared to other sectors, such as Academia and Government. This limited the diversity of perspectives and resources available at the event. To encourage greater involvement, proactive engagement strategies should be developed, including targeted outreach, partnerships, and customized incentives for private sector entities.

2. Early Planning

Timely planning is essential for the success of an event of this scale. Preparations should commence well in advance, with key milestones clearly defined. Setting the event date at the very beginning ensures all stakeholders can align their schedules and contribute effectively. A comprehensive project timeline and roadmap should guide the planning process to avoid last-minute challenges.

3. Sensitization Workshops

To boost stakeholder engagement and ensure their active participation, sensitization workshops should be organized well before the event. These workshops can help in raising awareness about the event's objectives, sharing roles and responsibilities, and fostering enthusiasm among participants from various sectors.

4. Budget Allocation

To streamline financial management, a dedicated budget head for the event should be created within the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) budget. This ensures that resources are available and allocated appropriately, reducing reliance on last-minute funding or external sponsors.

5. Coordination with Event Management Company

While PBS's management committees were provided with a proper list of focal persons from the Event Management Company. The coordination was ineffective. Regular coordination meetings should be scheduled, and clear communication protocols established to avoid misunderstandings and ensure seamless collaboration between PBS and the Event Management Company.

6. Internet Connectivity

Despite PBS arranging a dedicated internet facility from NayaTel, connectivity issues persisted during the event. To prevent such disruptions in future events, backup internet solutions should be arranged. Additionally, a technical team should be on standby to address connectivity problems promptly.





7. Event Highlights

The event lacked a system to keep attendees informed about ongoing activities. Installing large SMD screens at strategic locations would allow live updates, real-time announcements, and key highlights to be displayed, enhancing participant engagement and overall experience.

8. Ensuring Cleanliness

The venue's sanitary conditions were poor during the event due to the absence of PBS's sanitary staff. Dedicated sanitary staff should be stationed at the venue throughout the event to maintain cleanliness and hygiene standards.

9. Progress Proforma

Progress proforma and reporting templates were not prepared beforehand, causing inefficiencies in tracking event progress. These proformas should be designed and shared in advance with all relevant teams to ensure smooth monitoring and documentation of event activities.

10. Improving Food Service and Venue Arrangements

Food service during the event was not properly managed, and the designated food area was not appropriate, leading to dissatisfaction among participants. To address this, a detailed food management plan should be developed in coordination with catering teams. This plan should include proper scheduling, queue management, and contingency measures to avoid delays or shortages. Additionally, selecting a more suitable and spacious food area should be prioritized to ensure comfort and convenience for attendees.

11. PBS Dashboard

Data displayed on the PBS dashboard during the event was not presented in a user-friendly or comprehensive manner. Future events should focus on enhancing dashboard functionality and design to ensure clarity, accuracy, and real-time data visualization. Training sessions for dashboard operators should also be conducted to minimize errors.

Addressing these lessons will significantly enhance the planning, execution, and impact of future Data Fest events, ensuring a seamless experience for all participants and stakeholders.

13 Conclusion: -

The successful conduct of Data Fest 2024 by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) underscored the organization's leadership in advancing data-driven decision-making and fostering meaningful collaboration among diverse stakeholders. This groundbreaking event, held at the Pak-China Centre, brought together a wide array of participants, including representatives from international organizations, government agencies, academia, the private sector, and civil society.
