## SUMMARYOF FINDINGS

The changes in the quarterly (Jan-Mar) figures of LFS 2009-10 vis-à-vis the same period of 2010-11, are given as below in the parenthesis in the order of 2009-10 and 2010-11.
i) Participation rate decrease ( $32.6 \%, 32.0 \%$ ). Similar configuration obtains in rural ( $34 \%, 33.7 \%$ ), \& urban ( $30 \%, 28.8 \%$ ) areas and in the case of males $(49.2 \%, 48.6 \%)$ \& females $(15.1 \%, 14.8 \%)$.
ii) Activity status indicates increase in informal sector (74.2\%, 75.6\%) and decrease in formal $(25.8 \%, 24.4 \%)$. However, females shares make opposite configuration, decrease in the former (74.3.\%, 73\%) and increase in the latter $(25.7 \%, 27 \%)$.
iii) Employment Status finds all categories on decline except own account workers( $34.3 \%, 35.6 \%$ ), more in the case of females than males.
iv) Employment by major industry divisions indicates agriculture \& allied activities ( $43.3 \%, 44.2 \%$ ), construction ( $6.9 \%, 7.6 \%$ ) and manufacturing ( $13.5 \%$. 13.6\%) trending up. The remaining groups seem to be on decline.
v) Mean Hours Worked during reference week decrease (47.2, 46.9). Similar in the case for males $(50.8,50.5)$ and in urban areas $(52.4,51.1)$ while opposite obtains in the case of females $(34.3,35.2)$ and in rural areas (44.9, 45.1).
vi) Unemployment rate increases $(5.7 \%, 6.1 \%)$ during the comparative periods. As by sex and area, the change is accrued by males ( $4.6 \%$, $5.1 \%$ ) and, in urban areas $(7.8 \%, 9.1 \%)$.
