## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The changes in the quarterly (July-Sept) figures of LFS 2010-11 vis-à-vis the same period of 2012-13, are given as below in the parenthesis in the order of previous (2010-11) versus current (2012-13) period.
i) Participation rate decreases a sort ( $33.3 \%, 33.0 \%$ ). Similar pattern obtains in the case of males ( $49.9 \%, 49.4 \%$ ) and females ( $15.8 \%$, $15.5 \%$ ) Area wise, rural rates $(34.7 \%, 34.6 \%)$ and urban ( $30.5 \%$, $29.9 \%$ ) are in sync with overall pattern, both for males and females.
ii) Activity status indicates decrease in formal sector (27.3\%, 26.9\%) and increase in informal $(72.7 \%, 73.1 \%)$. The balance of change in either case seems more of male provenance and in rural areas.
iii) Employment Status finds own account workers, (34.0\%, 32.8\%), contributing family workers ( $28.3 \%, 26.2 \%$ ), on decline employee $(36.2 \%, 39.5 \%)$ waxing while employers $(1.5 \%, 1.5 \%)$ level same.
iv) Employment by major industry divisions shows categories except manufacturing, construction and other community/social \& personal services trending down more for males than female. Generally, sex disaggregated indicators follow the movement of over all figures.
v) Mean hours worked decrease ( $49.6 \%, 46.2 \%$ ) both in the case of males ( $50.4 \%, 49.6 \%$ ) and females ( $34.7 \%, 34.2 \%$ ).
vi) Unemployment rate ( $6.0 \%, 6.1 \%$ ) seems a sort on rise during the comparative period. Change appears of male provenance $(4.9 \%, 5.1 \%)$ and in rural areas $(4.8 \%, 5.0 \%)$.
