## RESULTS OF 6<sup>TH</sup> POPULATION HOUSING CENSUS-2017

As per decision of Council of Common Interest (CCI) to conduct Population and Housing Census-2017 started from 15th March to 24th May, 2017. Provisional results were notified in November 2017, however due to opposing of some stakeholders final results were not approved. Keeping in view the sensitivity of the Census results the Cabinet decided to constitute a Ministers Committee on 11.02.2020 for detailed deliberations on the matter with stakeholders and for recommendations regarding finalization of results of Census-2017. The Committee conducted six meetings and after extensive discussions & considerations submitted its report with recommendations for approval of results of Census-2017 in a larger national interest and to the conduct next census earlier possible by adopting modern technologies. The Cabinet in its meeting held on 22.12.2020 approved the Committee recommendations for forwarding it to CCI 44th meeting for final consideration. CCI in its 44th meeting held on 07-04-2021 considered the summary for approval of the recommendations of final results of Census-2017. The CCI in its 45th meeting held on 12.04.2021 deliberated on the subject and approved the final results of Census-2017. The final results have published through gazette notifica-

tion dated 27.05.2021 and also been uploaded on the PBS's website i.e. <a href="www.pbs.gov.pk">www.pbs.gov.pk</a> for the use of General Public and other stakeholders etc. Detail results including Age, sex distribution is also provided to users/ policy makers for informed decision making.



## CONDUCT OF 7th POPULATION & HOUSING CENSUS

## (Proceeding of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Upcoming Census Committee)

Ministry of PD&SI has constituted a twelve members Committee comprising of renowned Demographers & Experts for recommendation & adoption of best practices for upcoming Census under the Chairmanship of Deputy Chairman Planning Commission (DCPC). First two meeting were held on 14-01-2021& 26-03-2021, Consequently, 4-meetings have been held from April to June, 2021. The fifth meeting of the committee for Recommendations & Adoption of Best Practices for upcoming Census was held, on 10th June, 2021 Mr. Asad Umar, Minister for Planning Development & Special Initiatives also attended the meeting through Zoom Link on invitation of worthy Chairman. To review the progress made so far by the committee regarding devising recommendation for conduct of upcoming Census.

Sixth Meeting of the committee was held on 25th June 2021, PBS provided the work done on TOR-4 regarding "To review the best practice of field operation including monitoring /supervision, and data processing to minimize the omission/ errors and complete coverage" along with consideration based review of Census 2017 process for improvement in upcoming Census. Representative from NADRA also attended the meeting detail deliberation were made on Civil Registration Management System (CRMS) and the updation of data on the system. It was discussed in the meeting that CRMS at this stage cannot be used as register for census, however PBS may discuss with NADRA for risk management mechanism for conducting Digital Census.



The chair direct the PBS to complete the report and submit first draft by 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2021.

### Approval of Results of PSLM District Level Survey, 2019-20 by Secretary PD&SI on 22<sup>nd</sup> May, 2021

PSLM 2019-20 survey has been completed successfully. This survey provides detailed outcome indicators at district level with urban / rural breakdown on, Education, Health, Housing, Water Sanitation & Hygiene, along with provision of information on Information Communication & Technology (ICT), Food Insecurity Experience Scale (FIES) and Disability & Migration up to district level. This survey is one of major source of monitoring of SDGs, 21 indicators are monitored through this survey. After successful completion of data collection & processing, results are prepared representative at district level, which will be the rich source for evidence base decision making.



Results of the PSLM 19-20 District level Survey were approved by the technical committee and presented to Secretary PD&SI on 22<sup>nd</sup> May, 2021 in a meeting at PBS H/Q Islamabad, Chief Economist, Member (Social Sector), Chief Macro, Chief SDGs, Chief ITF and Deputy Chief

(Employment & Research) PD&SI and representatives of PBS attended the meeting. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, Member (SS/RM) informed that along with results a customized dash board has been prepared for providing data in interactive way along with time series trends for convenience of data users/ policy makers. Results of PSLM 2019-20 District Level Survey have been highly appreciated by all participants of the meeting. Secretary PD&SI while applauding the efforts of PBS added that the information provided by PSLM 2019-20 is the way forward/ basic necessity for informed decision making for the Federal PSDP and preparation of annual development plans at the district level for resource allocation /planning purposes. He approved the results of PSLM 19-20 district level survey along with micro data and online dash board and directed that results may be shared and presented to Provincial Planning & Development Departments & Bureau of statistics for its effective utilization for data driven decisions.


Pakistan Social & Living Standards Measurement (PSLM)/HIES Survey 2021-22

PSLM/ HIES 2021-22 is planned to be started from July-2021. Preparation of the survey is in progress. It is 13<sup>th</sup> round of PSLM surveys since 2004-05 for monitoring of development plans at the provincial/ district level in the overall context of SDGs. #### **Pakistan Demographic Survey-2021**

**F**ield Operation of twentieth round of Pakistan Demographic Survey (PDS-2020) has started from 28th April, 2021. Data for PDS-

2020 is being collected through Electronic Devices (Tablets) for which a user friendly software has been developed by DP Centre. Data can be collected in both Urdu and English languages Sixty-Nine female enumerators from 21 Re-



gional/ Field offices of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics are involved in Data Collection. Despite the peak of 3rd wave of pandemic the field operation was started and field force of PBS is fulfilling the said task by following the SOPs for COVID-19. Enumeration being a tough job has become more difficult due to pandemic but the field activities are smoothly carried out which show the dedication of field staff towards their job. 50% field enumeration has completed. By the end of August 2021, 100% enumeration will be completed. After enumeration the data is synced online by the enumerators. The field activities are also monitored through GPS tracking. Hence, use of electronic devices in data collection is a step towards transparency and reliability of data...



#### **Online Monitoring:**

A monitoring dashboard developed by DP Centre shows values of different indicators at National and Regional level. Besides, office wise progress of survey is updated as soon as the data is synced by Field Staff. Performance of Field staff can also be monitored by respective office Incharges, DP Centre and PDS Section.



### **Online Editing / Coding:**

DP Centre has developed software for online Editing / Coding and online Editing / Coding of PDS 2020 has started from 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2021 by Staff of PDS Section at head office.


# Approval of 7<sup>th</sup> Round Report on National Health Accounts, Pakistan 2017-18


Pakistan Bureau of Statistics has released the seventh round report of National Health Accounts-Pakistan (NHA) for the reference period 2017-18. In NHA-Pakistan 2017-18 report, core classifications namely- financing sources, financing agents and health care providers have been developed on the actual data on health expenditures obtained from various source agencies or financing agents as per the framework of "NHA Producer's Guide" with specific applications for low and middle income countries". NHA has been compiled by incorporating actual results of Out Of Pocket (OOP) survey and private health care provider's census/survey.

The summary of the results of the Seventh round of NHA-Pakistan 2017-18 reveals that total health expenditures are recorded at Rs. 1,206.0 billion including both current and development expenditures. According to financing agents, the general government expenditures are around 41.0% of total health expenditures. Out of Pocket health expenditures are Rs. 623.0 billion which is about 52.0% of total health expenditures and 88.0% of the total private health expenditure.

Moreover, The annual per capita Current Health Expenditures (CHE) for Pakistan as per NHA 2017-18 are (48.1US\$) Rs. 5,283 while in

NHA 2015-16 it was (45.0 US\$) Rs. 4,688. The ratio of CHE to Gross Domestic Product (GDP) according to NHA 2017-18 is 3.2% while the ratio of general government health expenditures to total general government final consumption expenditure is 12.2%. The ratio of private sector health expenditures according to NHA over total household final consumption expenditure are 2.5%.

## Price Inflation Situation (Apr-Jun, 2021)

Pakistan Bureau of Statistics is responsible for collection, compilation and preparation of retail / wholesale prices, as well as, computation of price indices. These indices are National Consumer Price Index (NCPI), Urban Consumer Price

Index (UCPI), Rural Consumer Price Index (RPI) and Wholesale Price Index (WPI) on monthly basis along with Sensitive Price Indicator (SPI) on weekly basis being prepared and released regularly.

The inflationary situation in Pakistan during the last quarter i.e., Apr-Jun., 2021 is given in Table-1 and Table-2.

Table-1 gives the snapshot of year on year (YoY) and month on month (MoM) inflation rate of General, Food and Non-Food Groups for National, Urban and Rural CPI.








The year on year (YoY) and month on month (MoM) inflation rates are graphically sketched in Figures 1-6 at urban, rural and national level.



#### **External Trade Statistics**

Exports from Pakistan: According to provisional figures compiled by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, exports from Pakistan during June, 2021 amounted to Rs. 426,126 million (provisional) and in May, 2021 is Rs.256,105 million showing an increase of 66.39% over May, 2021 and in June, 2020 is Rs.263,985 million showing of 61.42% over June, 2020.

Exports during July – June, 2020 – 2021 totaled Rs. 4,041,973 million (provisional) as against Rs. 3,369,782 million during the corresponding period of last year showing an increase of 19.95%.

Imports into Pakistan: Imports into Pakistan during June, 2021 amounted to Rs. 995,843 million (provisional) as against Rs.811,947 million in May 2021 and Rs.611,449 million during June, 2020 showing an increase of 22.65% over May, 2021 and of 62.87% over June, 2020. Imports during July – June, 2020 - 2021 totaled Rs. 8,986,371 million (provisional) as against Rs. 7,029,819 million during the corresponding period of last year showing an increase of 27.83%.

Balance of Trade: Based on provisional figures of imports and exports the balance of trade in Jun, 2021 was (-) 569,717 million in terms of Rupees. The balance of trade figures

Labour Force Survey is the regular activity of Pakistan Bureau of statistics and its results are pivotal for manpower planning, development and policies making.

Labour force Section is first time conducting Labour Force Survey 2020—21 at district level with a sample size of about 1,050000 households (7206 EBs.) The survey result will be representative at district level.

Status of LFS 2020-21

- The field operation of the survey has been completed and editing and data cleaning work is in progress.
- 80% cleaning and editing work of the fourth quarter is completed.
- Un-weighted tables of the first two quarters have been generated and of third quarter are in progress.
- Annual report of LFS 2020-21 will be prepared by March, 2022.






tiano Ferraz for technical input and advise for development of sample design for IAC.



b. A field visit was conducted on 08.06.2021 in cooperation with district administration of Kasur to Pre-Test the questionnaires designed for the said census. Mouza Wadana, Tehsil and District Kasur was visited for the said purpose. Thirty-one officers and officials of ACO Wing participated in this activity. This activity enabled the officers / officials of ACO Wing to calculate the time consumption for filling the questionnaires, sequence of questionnaires and other ground realities that the enumerators will face during the field operation of said census.

#### **SESRIC**

SESRIC, in collaboration with the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD), organised a Workshop on 'Use of Administrative Registers for Population and Housing Censuses' on 29-30 June 2021 through a video conferencing platform with the participation of 126 attendees from the NSOs of 32 OIC member countries and representatives of United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and US Census Bureau.

Organised within the framework of the ongoing cooperation between SESRIC and UNSD for the 2020 round of World Population and Housing Census Programme, the Workshop aimed at focusing on key considerations and requirements for transitioning from traditional census to alternative census methodologies involving the use of administrative registers and building institutional capacity and infrastructure for maintaining statistical registers for successful implementation of population and housing censuses.

H.E. Mr. Nyakassi M. B. SANYANG, Statistician General of the Gambia Bureau of Statistics and the Chairman of the 9th Session of OIC-StatCom, stated in his welcoming remarks that though a number of OIC member countries have successfully transitioned from the traditional method to a combined or fully register-based census, there is a wide variation among OIC countries in terms of the availability and quality of administrative registers and the capacity of national statistical systems to leverage the use of administrative data for statistical purposes. In this regard, by learning from each other's experiences as well as expertise of UNSD, it will help the NSOs of OIC countries to get to the intended levels.

In his opening speech, Mr. Fadi FARASIN, Assistant Director General of SESRIC, empha-

sised the vital role of population and housing censuses in national statistical systems, especially for the production of official statistics on a wide range of topics related to demography, and social, economic and housing characteristics. Especially COVID-19 pandemic has accelerated existing initiatives in the OIC member countries aimed at using administrative registers.

In his opening remarks, Mr. Srdjan Mrkić, Chief of Demographic Statistics at UNSD, underlined that the move to a register-based census needs to be carefully managed, and there are necessary conditions relating to data, technology, legal and stakeholder issues that must be considered for a successful transition from a traditional census to that involving the use of administrative registers.


The Workshop on 'Use of Administrative Registers for Population and Housing Censuses' covered the following topics:

- Necessary conditions for the use of administrative registers for population and housing censuses
- Establishing base registers for transitioning to a combined or regis-

ter-based census

- Building comprehensive and reliable statistical registers for censuses and for combining with survey data
- Evaluation of the quality of data and communication with register-owners to improve the quality

The Workshop was conducted through a video conferencing platform by following synchronous learning and instruction approaches designed in line with the virtual training solutions undertaken by SESRIC in order to better serve the Centre's training activities and keep participants motivated and engaged during this time of global crisis due to COVID-19.
