## **DR. NAEEM UZ ZAFAR** Chief Statistician

Dr. Naeem -uz- Zafar did his Doctorate in economics from Northern Illinois University, USA in 2010. Prior to that, he did his MBA from Institute of Business Administration, Karachi and undergraduate in Mechanical Engineering from NED University, Karachi in years 1998 and 1990 respectively. Since graduation from NED university, his professional career has been diverse; stating from machine tools and power generation to university teaching and development management.

He worked in engineering concern till 1998. After then, he switched to university teaching and taught various quantitative and economics courses at undergraduate and graduate level till 2014. His core areas were econometrics and labor economics. During his academic career, he headed graduate economic program beside doing teaching and research.

In 2014, he switched to Government by joining Planning Commission as Member Social Sectors. During his term, he was able to publish first official Multidimensional Poverty report based on PBS's Pakistan Standards of Living Measurement in 2015. This poverty index helps in broad identification of lagging areas and it is used by provincial and federal government for equitable development planning. Besides, he was also able to switch Poverty Estimation from, narrowly defined, Food-Expenditure-Intake (FEI) Method to, more relevant, Cost of Basic Needs (CBN) Method in 2016. After completing his term of Member Planning, he joined UNDP as advisor and worked for one year for institutionalizing SDGs at federal and provincial levels. He worked with national and sub-national governments and helped them in adopting Mainstreaming Acceleration and Policy Support (MAPS) for implementing SDGs. He contributed significantly in identifying reporting gaps for SDGs and devised short and term strategies for reducing these gaps.


In year 2017, he joined Government of Sindh as Chief Economist and worked there for four years. As Chief Economist, he headed the Technical Committee of Planning & Development Department (P&DD). The committee appraises development projects from forty-eight departments to formulate Annual Development Budget. He also led the foreign aid section which is responsible for seeking loan and grants from multilateral and bilateral development partners for financing priority projects. During his four years stay in Sindh, he contributed substantially in formulating mid-term development strategies and institutional strengthening of P&DD and its attached departments. He was actively involved in reorganization and institutional development of Sindh Bureau of Statistics and Research & Training Wing, two attached departments of P&DD, Sindh.

## **Chief Statistician** Taking oath at President House Islamabad

Dr. Naeem uz Zafar was sworn in as the 2<sup>nd</sup> Chief Statistician of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) on 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2021 under the **Article 14, sections 1& 2** of General Statistical (Reorganization) Act, 2011. Dr. Arif Alvi, the President of Islamic Republic of Pakistan administered to him as Chief Statistician at Aiwan-e-Sadr.

Dr. Naeem has a diversified experience of working on key posts in different public organizations/departments and performed prime responsibilities of his portfolios. The post of Chief Statistician had fallen vacant on **July 4, 2017** after completion of the tenure by Mr. Asif Bajwa.

He assumed the charge of his office on 24<sup>th</sup> of September, 2021 in Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, Islambad.

### MEETINGS OF THE CENSUS AD-VISORY COMMITTEE REGARDING CONDUCT OF 7<sup>th</sup> POPULATION & HOUSING CENSUS

Seventh & Eighth Meeting of Committee Constituted For Recommendations & Adoption of Best Practices for Upcoming Population Census.

Two meetings of the Census Advisory Committee constituted for "Recommendations & Adoption of Best Practices for upcoming Population Census", were held on 15th July, 2021, first at 10.00 am under the chair of the Deputy Chairman Planning Commission (DCPC) for deliberate & finalize on the committee recommendations which were further presented in second meeting held at 2.00 pm under chair of Minster PD&SI in the Committee Room at 1st floor of Ministry of PD&SI, Mr. Muhammad Jehanzeb Khan Deputy Chairman Planning Commission (DCPC), Chairman of the committee briefed the worthy chair regarding the recommendations of the committee and highly appreciated the dedication of PBS and committee members for devising recommendations and preparation of report. He informed that being sensitive exercise, it is strongly recommended that Census may be planned and conducted with Project Approach for sys-



tematic application of all steps, including monitoring & evaluation and third party validation for timely completion, transparency and credibility of the process. He informed that Committee has



agreed on broad recommendations and technical matters may be deliberated in detail in the specialized committees. Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal Member secretary of the committee presented the recommendation in detail.

Minister PD&SI, expressed satisfaction on adoption of UN principles by aligning them to country specific conditions and delinking of verification of census data with CNIC at stage of enumeration. However, he strongly urged that efforts must be made to ensure full coverage as ultimately data collected through census will be linked with NADRA registration data and eventually with voter lists, which had created controversies in the last census. He also emphasized on extensive communication/ publicity campaign to create awareness about population Census objective & to tackle the propaganda of negative campaign.

Eighth meeting of the Committee constituted for "Recommendations & Adoption of Best Practices for upcoming Population Census", was held virtually on 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2021, at 3.00 pm





under the chair of the Deputy Chairman Planning Commission (DCPC) in the Committee Room at 1<sup>st</sup> floor of Ministry of PD&SI. Main objective of this meeting is to deliberate, in detail, the data enumeration methodology with its pros and cons after detail deliberation it was again decided by committee that De jure method of enumeration may be adopted, however, comprehensive training may be imparted for clarity of concept especially usual place of residence.



Detailed presentation regarding the "Optimum Use of Modern Technology in Upcoming Census" was given to Minister Information Technology & Telecommunication and Chairman NA-DRA for devising the way forward for successful conduct of first ever "Digital Census". Minster of M/O IT&T highly appreciated the methodology and mechanism being devised for conduct of first ever Digital Census and ensures full support & cooperation from Ministry of IT&T.

#### CONSULTATIVE MEETINGS FOR **PREPARATION AND CONDUCT OF 7<sup>TH</sup> POPULATION & HOUSING CENSUS.**

The Population & Housing Census is crucial national exercise linked with provision of data for key policy making matters regarding development programs, political representation & resource allocation which have far reaching impacts. Keeping in view the importance & sensitivity of matter and decision of CCI to conduct next census as early possible by using modern technologies, Government of Pakistan constituted a Census Advisory Committee of renowned Demographers & Experts from all Provinces under the Chair of Deputy Chairman Planning Commission (DCPC) to bring credibility & transparency to the whole Census & to adopt best International practices for conducting the Population & Housing Census. The Committee after series of meeting devised recommendations and strongly proposed that in order to bring transparency, credibility and ownership of whole census processes, Provinces must be involved from start to end i.e. from planning to compilation of census results.





2. Accordingly, Consultation Process for finalizing the recommendations of committee was initiated for conduct of 7<sup>th</sup> Population & Housing Census and initial online orientation meeting with Chief Secretaries of all Provinces/ regions was held on 13<sup>th</sup> of August, 2021 under the Chairmanship of Secretary, M/o PD&SI.



It was decided that physical meetings of PBS teams will be held with provincial governments/ AJ&K & GB for detailed deliberation and feedback on recommendations before its finalization for approval from the appropriate forum. In pursuance of the decisions of the above meeting, following meeting with provinces have been conducted so far:

3. All the meetings were attended by Secretaries and representatives of Education, Health, Home, Local Government, Board of Revenue and planning & Development and other relevant representatives of the concerned province. In all meetings on behalf of PBS, Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, team lead of PBS/ Focal person presented in detail the broader recommendations of the Census Advisory Committee with clear roadmap and timelines to complete the process.

It was informed that as per directions of the CCI, the upcoming Census will be the first ever "Digital Census" of Pakistan, the detail methodology and use of modern technology was explained to all honorable participant of meetings. He also highlighted role of provinces in the field of data collection & monitoring process and informed that all the feedback regarding process and the tools will be incorporated in the recommenda-

Detailed in house strategic meetings & commotional meeting with Ministry of IT&T, NTC, NADRA, SUPARCO & other organizations are in progress.







### MEETING OF THE TECHNICAL COM-MITTEE FOR FINALIZATION OF THE 7<sup>TH</sup> POPULATION & HOUSING CEN-SUS QUESTIONNAIRE.

A meeting of Census Questionnaire Committee, constituted to review/ finalize the questionnaire for **first ever digital Population and Housing Census - 2022** of Pakistan, was held on 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2021 (Wednesday) at 12:00 PM in the Conference Room of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS), Islamabad under the chairmanship of Dr. G. M. Arif, Demographer. All Members/ Participants from outside PBS joined the meeting virtually on zoom

#### **Decisions:**

- Single questionnaire may be administered, strictly in relevance to census objectives.
- The explanation of Col 1 for exclusion / inclusion of household members may be rephrased to give clarity and avoid confusion.
- Two to three questions on disability may be asked to capture prevalence and type of disability
- The lowest age limit for asking marital status must be 10 years and above to capture the responses at maximum level.
- The additional columns of day and month of birth must be skipped and age should be asked in complete years.
- To capture the status of migration from Rural or Urban domain, one more ques-

tion should be added in the questionnaire.

- Revisit the field of Education in terms of field of education.
- Revisit the definition of 'urban' for the next census.

Meeting was ended with vote of thanks to and from the chair.

## CONSULTATIVE MEETINGS WITH WORLD BANK (WB) ON STATISTICS IN PAKISTAN

The World Bank (WB) and Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) have jointly finalized the certain areas of collaboration to support the strengthening of PBS institutional architecture in a meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2021 at 10.00 am (virtually). Chief Statistician (PBS)/ Secretary PD&SI and Ms. Rabia Awan, Director (PBS) were representatives of PBS in the meeting, whereas, Mr. Najy Benhaaine, Country Director (WB Pakistan), Ms. Silvia Redaelli, Senior Economist (poverty & Equity), Mr. Moritz Meyer, Senior Economist (Poverty & Equity Global Practice) and Mr. Rafay Khan, Economist (Finance, Competitiveness and innovation Global Practice) were among the representatives of the World Bank. The main objective of the meeting was to explore the avenues where PBS and World Bank can work together for strengthening statistical system and improv-

ing data reporting mechanisms and in this context some thematic areas were identified. It was decided that a series of follow-up meetings between WB and PBS will be held in the 3rd and 4th quarter of 2021 on identified thematic areas for devising action plan to achieve the main objective of the collaboration.

**PBS NEWS BULLETIN** 

11<sup>th</sup> Issue

The first consultation between PBS and WB on strengthening the capacity of the national statistical systems focused on "Preparation and implementation support of the upcoming Censuses" was held on 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2021. The objective of the meeting was to learn about the plan and timelines for each of the planned census activities and identify areas for collaboration with the WB. Detailed presentations were made by Ms. Rabia Awan, Director (CP&C/CP&MU), Syed Abdul Qadir Ali Shah, Director (Economic Census) and Naved Igbal, Joint Agricultural Census Commissioner on Housing and Population Census – 2022, Economic Census and Agriculture Census – 2023, respectively. Dr. Amjad Javed Agricultural Census Commissioner Sandhu, (PBS), Mr. Yasir Ishfaq, Director (PBS), Mr. Moritz Meyer, Senior Economist (WB) and Ms. Maria Qazi, Research Analyst (WB) were among other participants of the meeting.

The second round of consultations between PBS and WB on strengthening the national statistical system in Pakistan focused on the recently launched National Strategy for the Development of Statistics 2021-2030 (NSDS) which was held on 4<sup>th</sup> August, 2021. The objective of the meeting was to learn about the opportunities and challenges surrounding the implementation of the NSDS. Detailed presentation was made by

Dr. Amjad Javed Sandu, Agricultural Census Commissioner (PBS) and afterwards brainstorming session on identifying the challenges and way forward were conducted to identify possible areas for collaboration. Chief Economist, Planning Division also participated in the meeting and requested WB team's assistance in bringing international best practice experience, particularly from other large middle-income countries facing similar contexts and development challenges, to identify obstacles which undermine the implementation of activities under the NSDS 2021-2030. It was proposed to discuss this request - including the terms of reference for the technical assistance - during the following-up meeting with PBS and Planning in next quarter. Mr. M. Ahmed Zubair, Chief Economist, Planning Commission, Ms. Rabia Awan, Director (PBS), Muhammad Sarfaraz, Chief Statistical Officer (PBS), Adnan Ghumman, Senior Economist (WB), Moritz Meyer, Senior Economist (WB), and Thomas Danielewitz, Senior Economist, Statistician (WB) was other participants of the meeting.

The third round of consultation between PBS and WB (ES team) on the availability of contact frames to conduct the Enterprise Surveys was held on 16<sup>th</sup> August, 2021. The objective of the meeting was to identify the available frames, discuss potential shortcomings and specific needs, and set the stage for the collaboration. Frames and universe estimates to be prepared and shared in the next weeks. Detail presentation was made by Mr. Rizwan Bashir, Director (EM, BR & Industry) and afterwards specific aspects of the areas were proposed for collaboration. Ms. Rabia Awan, Director (PBS), Mr. Muhammad Anwar, Chief Statistical Officer (PBS), Mr. Jorge Rodriguez, Program Manager (WB), Ms. Silvia Muzi, Program Coordinator (WB), Mr. Rafay Kahn, Economist (WB), and Mr. Domenico Viganola, TTL of the ES Pakistan 2021 (WB) were among other participants of the meeting.

WB appreciated the efforts and work plans of PBS to implement the best international practices to keep pace with the statistical advancement in the globe. A comprehensive document will be prepared with highlighting the possible areas of cooperation and roadmap for further decision and consultations with the WB.



### **EXTERNAL TRADE STATISTICS** (AUGUST, 2021)

#### **Exports from Pakistan**

According to the provisional figures compiled by the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, exports from Pakistan during **August**, **2021** amounted to **Rs. 368,847 million** (provisional) as against **Rs. 373,412 million** (provisional) in **July**, **2021** and **Rs. 265,600 million** during **August**, **2020** showing a decrease of **1.22%** over July, **2021** but an increase of **38.87%** over **August**, **2020**.

### PAKISTAN DEMOGRAPHIC SURVEY

#### Pakistan Demographic Survey (PDS)

provides reliable data on Population dynamics during inter-censal period. Demographic statistics are inevitable for policy makers, planning and administrators. Current round of PDS is twentieth in series. The field work of Pakistan Demographic Survey 2020 was started on 28th April 2021 and will be completed in September 2021. 21 Regional and Field offices of **PBS** are involved in Field Operation. For the first time tablet based data collection was adopted for said survey, which is a remarkable step towards digitization. Almost 97 percent field operation is completed and hopefully will be completed 100% by end of September, 2021 and real time monitoring has become it evident that the indicators are in lines with all similar surveys. The transition towards digitization has increased the reliability and transparency of survey results. 85% online editing coding has been completed with the support of SS Wing of PBS. It is worth mentioning here that the report of the survey will be furnished by the end of **December**, 2021 as targeted in CPI 2021-2022. ### "RE-BASING OF QIM"

Census of Manufacturing Industries 2015-16 results are finalized and on the basis of results, rebasing of QIM has been started. A meeting was held with data source agencies to discuss rebasing procedures, responsibilities of data sources, inclusion and exclusion of items, classification under PSIC-10, provincially representative coverage, enhance weightage and sample design. In this regard, provincial Bureau of Statistics have started working on collection of data from their respective regions while R/O Rawalpindi is collecting data from ICT based industries.



### **ECONOMIC CENSUS**

Economic Census Section of PBS is working on the conduct of 2<sup>nd</sup> Economic Census in the country which is the second-largest statistical activity after Population and Housing Census (P&HC). The following were the major activities of this section during the first quarter of Financial Year 2021-22.

#### i. Combined House-Listing Form

Due to decision of the CCI in its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> April 2021, the Population & Housing Census will be held as early as possible. It was proposed that House-Listing Operation of the Economic Census and Population & Housing Census may be combined which will reduce field operation cost and enhance data quality. In this regard, an integrated House-Listing Form (HL-Form) for both the censuses has been designed, which will capture the formal as well as informal economic units in the country and classify them upto two-digits Pakistan Standard Industrial Classification (PSIC) code. The combined House-Listing Form has been sent to the concerned section for further deliberation on it in the Technical Committee on Questionnaire of Population and Housing Census.

### ii. Workshop on Pakistan Stanadard Industrial Classification (PISC)

Economic Census (EC) Section also organized a two-days workshop on Pakistan Standard Industrial Classification (PISC) in collaboration with Training Wing of PBS aiming to abreast the staff with the PSIC Coding System which will be used during the House-Listing Operation. Participants from various sections of PBS attended the workshop on 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2021.

#### iii. Meeting with State Bank of Pakistan

A Zoom meeting was held on August 11, 2021 with State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) regarding updates on the Census of Business Enterprises (CBE) under National Financial Inclusion Strategy (NFIS) 2023. Director (EC), presented the progress and apprised the meeting participants about the latest developments. He informed the SBP that due to CCI decision in its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2021 for early conduct of Population and Housing Census, it is not possible for the PBS to conduct Economic Census. However, a combine House-Listing Operation for the Economic Census and Population & Housing Census was proposed. The combined House-Listing Form has been sent to the concerned section for further deliberation on it in the Technical Committee on Questionnaire of Population & Housing Census.



### ANNUAL CONTRACEPTIVE PERFOR-MANCE REPORTS, 2019-20

The task of producing Contraceptive Performance Report has been assigned to PBS as a sequel to the devolution of Ministry of Population Welfare (MoPW). Pursuantly, Population Welfare Statistics (PWS) Section of PBS has so far released 10<sup>th</sup> issues of Annual Contraceptive Performance Reports since 2010-11. In these reports, secondary data relating to Contraceptive Performance of Public Sector and Private Sector represented by three eminent NGO(s), involved in service delivery, had been presented in the form of different tables.



Ministry of Planning Development & special initiatives Pakistan Bureau of Statistics www.pbs.gov.pk The main findings of the Annual Contraceptive Performance Report, 2019-20 are as under:

Overall Contraceptive Performance in terms of Couple Years of Protection (CYP) for the year 2019- 20 as compared to 2018-19, has been computed as -8.3%, based on Family Planning Service Statistics data. Overall Contraceptive Performance of Population Welfare Departments (PWDs), Departments of Health (Health Facilities), Departments of Health (LHWs) for the year 2019-20 in terms of Couple Years of Protection (CYP) has decreased by 24.5%, 6.8% and 26.7% respectively while an increase in performance has been observed in NGOs i.e. 20.6% in comparison with the last year 2018-19. Annual estimates of modern Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (mCPR), by using an approxi-mation of Estimated Modern Method Use (EMU) rates, computed through services statistics, during the year 2019-20 is 41.0%, whereas 42.8% during 2018-19. Overall mCPR of all stakeholders during 2019-20 when compared with 2018-19, has shown a decrease of 4.1%.

The Covid-19 has adversely affected the provision of Family Planning Programme Service in quarter-4 of 2019-20. Therefore, the progress of Contraceptive Performance showed a decreased by 8.3%.



### AGRICULTURAL CENSUS WING

The Agricultural Census Wing of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics, Lahore is planning to conduct Agricultural Census in the year 2022. Currently this wing is engaged in the planning and preparatory work of the said census.

In the past, Agricultural, Livestock and Agricultural Machinery Censuses were conducted independently on decennial basis but now for the first time an Integrated Agricultural Census by merging these three censuses will be carried out. Thus, this census is of huge importance for all the stakeholders and with the consultation of stakeholders questionnaires have been finalized.

The new sample design for the said census has also been finalized by the Sample Design Section of PBS with the consultation of the expert from FAO. Further to above, it is also worth mentioning here that as per the directives of Government of Pakistan and subsequently guidelines provided by PBS, HQs the work on upcoming 7<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census-2022 has also been initiated in this office.

It is apprised that an online meeting was held on 06.07.2021 under the Chairmanship of Mr. Muhammad Sarwar Gondal, Member (RM/SS) at PBS (HQ), Islamabad wherein major features of newly developed Sample Design for Integrated Agricultural Census (IAC) were shared with the participants. The PBS Members and senior officers from PBS, HQ and PBS Office, Lahore attended the meeting, whereas representatives and stakeholders from Federal Ministries and Provinces participated online via Zoom link. Moreover, Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Na-



tions (FAO)' country representative also participated through ZOOM.

Ms. Rabia Awan, Director Sample Design (SD) presented salient features of newly developed Sample Design for Integrated Agricultural Census (IAC) during the meeting alongwith brief history of Agricultural Census Wing (ACW) and the activities performed by ACW since inception of Agricultural Census Organization (defunct). All the participants showed keen interest in the





new Sample Design and participated enthusiastically; specially provincial stakeholders from Provincial Bureaus, Crop Reporting Services, and Livestock and Dairy Development Departments raised interesting queries which were responded and clarified by the PBS officers. The participants appreciated the efforts put in by the PBS in the preparation of this new Sample Design of complex nature and they expressed their satisfaction on the newly developed IAC Sample Design.

#### **AGRICULTURAL CENSUS-2022**

- The first stage is the planning and preparation for the subject census. In this regard, major activities are carried out in this office during the period under reference with the support of PBS, HQs and other major stakeholders. These activities include:

- a. Census Methodology, Tabulations Plan and Computer edit Specifications are also finalized during this quarter.
- a. The Data Processing Centre, Lahore with the close collaboration of Agricultural Census
   Wing is engaged in Software Development for tablet based data collection, data pro-



cessing & tabulations in connection with Pilot Survey of Agricultural Census-2022.

 As a part of preparatory work and in the light of upcoming Pilot Survey for Agricultural Census-2022, an in-house training program regarding questionnaires for the officers / officials of this Bureau including all the wings had been carried out from 02.08.2021 to 13.08.2021 at PBS, Lahore.

#### I. Internship

PBS, HQs had allowed three students of BS(Hons)-Statistics from Lahore College for Women University (LCWU), Lahore for in-



ternship over a period of 4-6 weeks in this office. They successfully completed their internship program in this office from **5<sup>th</sup> August**, **2021 to 10<sup>th</sup> September**, **2021**.

During this internship they were trained / briefed about the working of all the wings / sections of this Bureau.

#### II. Meetings and Seminars

A comprehensive meeting was held on **06.09.2021** in the committee room of PBS, Lahore regarding upcoming 7<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census-2022. The Consultant on Digital Census, PBS (HQ), Islamabad gave a comprehensive presentation regarding proposed working mechanism to be adopted in the said census. The Member (C&S/RM) alongwith senior officers from PBS, HQs and PBS, Lahore participated in this meeting.

### GLOBAL CONFERENCE OF STATIS-TICAL DATA AND METADATA EX-CHANGE (SDMX).




It was informative conference particularly with reference to statistical practices adopted by various countries around the globe. The main feature of the conference was the release of third version of SDMX 3.0 which is improved version of SDMX 2.0. Pakistan Bureau of Statistics is already using the concept of SDMX for Nation Accounts. Therefore, PBS must go for adoption of SDMX 3.0 version through capacity building with the support of United Nation Statistics Division (UNSD).


A special virtual meeting of HLG-PCCB for selection of the hosts of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> United Nations World Data Forum (UNWDF) for the years 2023 and 2024, was convened on 14.09.2021







During the meeting bids of four countries viz China for 2023 while Bahrain, Colombia, and Egypt for 2024 to host the future 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> UNWDF were discussed. All the countries presented their plans, facilities, attractions and past experiences (if any), to host the future meetings. After presentations, all the member countries casted vote for bidders. As a result of voting, China was elected to host the 4<sup>th</sup> UNWDF and Colombia was elected to host the 5<sup>th</sup> UNWDF.
