## **INAUGURATION DAY-1: DataFest-2024:**

- "Unleashing the Power of Data for Development"
- "Empowering Decisions with Data"

Islamabad, October 21, 2024 – The Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) proudly hosted Data Fest-2024 at the Pak China Friendship Centre, bringing together experts, researchers, and data enthusiasts from diverse fields to explore the critical role of data in shaping policies and driving innovation for a better future.
